I stayed with different people, sharing a dormitory with many different kinds of people; sharing meals together for a whole year. I take that with me as I was never really good with people until last year when I was at MCC." Gugulethu is doing her first year in B.Com General.

Linda Ndlovu was amongst our top students and obtained a bursary from Shell SA Refining. He is currently enrolled for a BSc degree, majoring in Chemistry and Chem Tech. Linda misses the college because he says he gained a lot of respect while he was at MCC. He said,

Simphiwe attended Midlands Community College in 2002. He comes from a very poor family and attended a high school where he never received much motivation. As a consequence, Simphiwe never really had any concrete plans for his future. Simphiwe had the following to say about his experience of attending MCC:

"I heard about MCC from a friend. I previously thought that just passing matric was enough. I never thought there could be anything better for me in life. I grew up in a very poor family and the school that I went to, even though I got F's for both Maths and Science, I was still amongst the few who passed matric that year.

I am really grateful that an opportunity to attend MCC was presented to me. I

slept after eating decent meals; I was able to have a shower and given shelter and also received good education for a very small financial contribution from my family. I was accepted at MCC with F's in Maths and Science but when I left the college I had obtained B's in both subjects. The environment and the systems that are in place changed my whole thinking. Coming from a school where education was just not a priority to a school where there is compulsory study time, my whole thinking changed. I started having dreams of my own. I had a firm idea of what kind of life I wanted to live and for the first time, I believed that it was possible for me to have a degree and a good job one day. I now have that degree in Geography and Environmental Studies and am currently studying towards a Honours Degree in

When I look back now, I know that everything I am, I owe to MCC. We lived in a RDP house and really struggled financially at home, but after being employed, I managed to build my parents a decent house and buy a house of my own. I am now married with children and moreover I am employed as a Manager in the Msunduzi Municipality's Human Settlements Division.

It is funny how life can just change around, and knowing it is through someone who gave selflessly, really humbles me. I am so grateful for everything that MCC did for us in 2002 and the work they continue to do. I have no doubt that the world is a better place because of MCC."

Meet Londiwe Nkabinde who is a Family Community Motivator in the College's Early Childhood Development Programme. She works in Bruntville, assisting children aged 0-4 so that they can have access to early learning opportunities.

This is what she had to say:

After my child was diagnosed with autism, I was faced with many challenges and decided to study ECD with the aim of coping with my own child. After attending all the short courses, I realised I could help many others with similar problems. This is after I noticed tremendous

changes in the development of my son with the help of the right toys. He is now a much happier child and coping with his condition and I am also a better parent and able to deal with him better.

I have a group of children who I meet with every day who are grouped according to their ages. We then meet in one of the homes in the community where I teach them through play. It is rewarding to see them grow and having an opportunity that they would not otherwise have had. Pre-schools and crechés are expensive, but MCC has given us a chance to bring the services free of charge so that more children have a good start in life.

I now have my own vision for the future and I know exactly what I want to do. I want to study further and become a specialist in inclusive education and teach children with special needs. I want to move people away from the stereotypes and negative beliefs they have about children with special needs."

A Family In Bruntville



Nomusa Sithole is the mother of Yoliswa (3) and a grandmother to Kwanele (4) who both participate in our non-centre based ECD Programme. A Family Community Motivator (FCM), Sthembile works with the children.

Nomusa has been taking part in the programme since Kwanele was one-year old. At that time Nomusa was very ill and struggled to care for the children but she had one less thing to worry about as MCC helped with appropriate stimulation and giving them access to learning from a very young age. Sthembile visited the family and played with

the children on a regular basis; assisted them to apply for social grants, including a health grant and helped them to learn how to take care of the children better. Nomusa is very excited that her children have a good start in life and believes that, when they start primary school, they will be as well prepared as the other children whose parents can afford pre-school fees as well as transport to school. Nomusa told us that her children are now more disciplined as they have learnt how to greet others and say "thank you"; play with other children without fighting with them and have acquired important knowledge such as their names, family names, colours, etc. She sees their development every day and is grateful for the opportunity the children have for proper early learning and development.
